Vice President's Report

It has been a significant year for the Association this year. Over the past 36 months a project has been underway to renew the Rules of the Association to meet current requirements of the Acts and Regulations made by the Parliament of Victoria.

In doing so there have been major changes made. These changes have in many ways made the Rules of Association simpler as they only need to address the matters included by the Law. This has meant that the previous set of rules, which had served the Geelong Hockey association for many years, included many items that are not of interest when it comes to Incorporation through Consumer Affairs Victoria. We were advised that should we have put those Rules forward they would have been rejected and a rewrite requested by CAV.

The content that is not required by CAV still needs to be captured and will be in a Policy and Procedures manual. This document, unlike the Rules, can be changed locally. They are not registered anywhere. These issues are the day to day operational instructions including such matters as the Competition Bylaws.

The Rules do make some significant changes around conduct of the formal meetings of Geelong Hockey Association i.e. AGM and SGM (if required). They also change membership arrangements which will be noticed by the affiliates who will be asked to nominate people for various positions prior to the AGM. There is no provision for nominations from the floor for Executive positions and voting will be the duty of a small number of people. This first year will be a learning opportunity. We shall see how we progress.

It is intended to get a group of interested people together post the AGM to work on compiling/completing the Policy and Procedures manual.

Thanks to Winchelsea Junior hockey club that was disbanded a number of years ago for the \$2,000 contribution towards the gates.

Finally to the other members of the management committee, again we have achieved a lot over the past year and it my pleasure working with you all on different levels.

Treasurer's Report

THE GEELONG HOCKEY ASSOCIATION THE TREASURER'S REPORT 2017-2018

The financial result was very similar to the previous year.

Several differences to highlight –

INCOME

- Masters Fees included over \$3,000 of late payments from the previous season.
- Coaching clinics for Junior players was a new revenue earner
- Income from the winter season was down with less teams and players involved
- Canteen revenue slightly above the previous year. The increase in payroll expenses was nearly offset by the 'Canteen levy' on winter team entries.

EXPENSES

- Advertising & Marketing includes a \$2,500 contribution to Hockey Victoria for the G21 review.
- Awards & trophies included the update of the honour boards & replacing lost pennants but were higher than anticipated because last year's invoice for \$3,411 was included in this year's accounts
- Legal fees included advice & registration for the new constitution required by Consumer Affairs.
- Depreciation is significantly lower this year because Pitch 1 is fully depreciated at 30.9.2017.
- CBA loan for a club room renovation was paid off in September. The committee decided to increase principal repayments on the Bendigo Loan for Pitch 2 by \$1,500 a month from October 1st 2018

SUMMARY

- Profit of \$14,470.71 reflects the decrease in annual depreciation on the Pitches & equipment

In conclusion I wish to thank Ian Sayers for his knowledge and support during the year. Gordon Burns for keeping accurate records for the hire of the facilities and Joyce Climpson for running the canteen very efficiently for another successful season.

All bank accounts, receivables, payables have been reconciled and are a true record of the financial details.

Unfortunately by the time we had facts and figures provided by HV including budget and a mechanism to get coaches paid most Clubs had given up a recruitment program for 2018.

This shows in our participant registrations.

As an Association it was decided (by Clubs) that we would not avail ourselves of HV's organisation and implementation in 2019. It does look like we will still need to use HV for payments of coaches. This is yet to be resolved. I will be working on this in the next short period hopefully having answers prior to the AGM.

It is of interest that Hockey Albury Wodonga is also going down the same path.

I am holding meetings of Club recruiters to try to ensure we get a better result for 2019. It is critical we get this right. If our organisation does not have a strong foundation we will inevitably slide further backward. Not a prospect any of us should accept.

Another exciting building project that took place in season 2017 was the Walters Family viewing platform, Shane and Scott Walters came up with a brilliant idea that not only solved the issue of the existing dug out that required removal; it solved a storage issue. By redesigning the old “Home” dug out on pitch one we now have some where to store the summer hockey game boards that have previously been stored in the cage store room. This means easier access for players putting out and bringing in the boards during the summer comp. It also means there is more room for storage cages in the future! Not to mention a great viewing platform for spectators. Special thanks to Shane Walters, Scott Walters, Anthony Leigh and Kane McAdam for the construction.

With another winter season over, the Hockey Geelong Executive is never resting. The committee members have many ideas to improve the use and function of Stead Park.

The Sunday before our designated School Clinic Week we were told only 3 schools had booked in.....and as the Hockey Victoria Clinic coach found out, some schools were not even aware that the clinics were running as HV had not confirmed with them. We were able to get to Herne Hill PS, Hamlyn Banks PS, East Geelong PS.

Alison O'Reilly and Gillie Pasque were also able to do a 2 hour clinic at Covenant College for Grades 3 and 4 only.

We had to try a different day due to pitch access and availability of helpers. We thought we would try a Sunday timeslot...which didn't really work. We only had 3 participants and 1 was a player from last year and the other 2 were the children of senior hockey players who didn't play the Winter Season.

We were lucky that all of our Junior participants in our Intra Club program from 2017 were ready to join in the HG competition 2018. We were able to field an U8, U10, U12 and U14 team.

The first time in many many years that our club has submitted 4 teams in the competition. Hopefully we improve on our attendance at our Come n Try 2019 program to booster our numbers from the U8 and u10 age groups.

In reviewing 2018 I have referred to our mission statement and judged our performance against this.

In 2018 we continued our maturation as a hockey club with the continuation of our young club being one of the premier clubs within the Geelong Hockey Association. Indeed, Torquay were one of only two clubs in the association to field at least one team in every level of the local competition, from u8s through all junior competition levels and to both Division 1 and Division 2 Mens and Womens competitions. We had finalist in all divisions of both junior and senior competitions and had four teams compete on Grand Final Day with the Under 14s and the senior men winning premierships.

We have maintained our registered playing members to levels similar to 2017. It is important in our continuing development that we continue to grow the club membership and we need to do this with a focus in the junior side of the club. Given the right environment these juniors will become the future of the club.

The Hookin2Hockey program this year was not as successful as we would have wanted with some of the circumstances out of our control. Administration issues with Hockey Victoria saw the Road Shows not implemented in the Hockey Geelong region in 2018. The club will put systems in place for next season that will ensure that this does not happen again. We are working with Hockey Geelong and the local clubs to provide a local solution to recruitment to ensure the growth of hockey in the region.

The G21 Region Hockey Strategy Draft has been published recently for comment, one of the critical priorities listed is "Following completion of a detailed business case, including a proposed funding model, seek funding for a local multipurpose synthetic competition standard hockey pitch at the Torquay Sports Precinct, in partnership with Surf Coast Secondary College." This puts the construction of a facility in Torquay firmly on the agenda. Hopefully in the near future we will be training in Torquay and playing our home games locally. This will be an opportunity to grow our participation with travel no longer being a barrier to those wanting to play hockey. Andrew Crowley has put a lot of work into securing a ground over the life of the club and his hard work is paying off. Well done Andrew.

These results and excitement for the future of the club do not happen without the dedication and work of the volunteers within the club.

I would like to thank the Committee from this season. We were able to expand our committee with new people coming on board and contributing to operations of the club. As we continue to grow it is important that we share the workload between the members that are invested in the success of Torquay Hockey Club. With Melissa Field and I stepping down as secretary and president respectively it is vital that we attract people with the necessary skills and passion to continue to drive the evolution of the club.

We are proud of and appreciative of the effort and dedication that our coaches bring to the club. Our Junior teams are benefitting from the continuity of our excellent junior coaches, who continue to encourage and develop our young players both on and off the field. Overall the coaches did a magnificent job in managing and teaching the playing group.

The volunteers that performed the role of team managers made the job of the coaches easier, they could concentrate on coaching, and I thank them for assisting in this role. The club continued to develop the ranks of our umpires this season with Scott Cullen taking on the role of coordinating the umpires. We are getting more juniors involved in umpiring and a wider variety of members umpiring at season level. We will continue to promote umpiring as an important contribution that the club makes to Hockey Geelong and the growth of our game.

The financial position of the club is sound, and we expect that the club will present a small surplus this year. A total of 14 players from 5 clubs participated at various times during the year – Geelong 1, Golden Plains 2, Kardinia 3, Newtown 7, Torquay 1. 12 of these girls were also playing in the normal mixed competitions, with 2 where this was their only participation, The program saw some significant improvements in skills and game strategies across the season. Feedback given at the end of the program indicated that all participants had enjoyed the program, and were keen to play again in 2019. With the G21 Regional Hockey Strategy about to be finalised, one of the strongest messages arising from it, is that Hockey Geelong must grow its membership base in order to be able to negotiate for more facilities and more funding from outside organisations.

Hockey Geelong is keen to support affiliated clubs to recruit new junior members and to promote the sport, in order to achieve strong and sustainable growth and development.

Thanks to all the administrators, coaches, team managers and umpires who participated in the 2018 season. Special thanks to Geoff Davie for his continuing work on behalf of Hockey Geelong, with regular reports and promotion of hockey in the Geelong Advertiser.
