President's Report

It is with pride that I put pen to paper as the anniversary of the 2018 AGM approaches. Of course, I have been officially President for about half that time and acting President for the remainder.

It has been an interesting time. It has been busy. Even after having been on the Executive Committee for a number of years I found the workload ramped up as time went on. This can be a very busy job.

And so, I find myself reviewing a year that has passed rapidly and viewing a future we need to grasp. There is so much that can, and ultimately, must be done. We are no longer an Association that can just fully focussed on our sport. Legislative changes mean we are now being required to look and act more like a business.

In keeping with this requirement, we introduced and had accepted at the AGM new Rules of Association. These give us a framework within which to run the "business". These Rules do not include many of the aspects included in the previous generation of Rules which had a strong focus on the sport.

The By- Laws still exist to cover the sporting aspect of the Association but, do need review which will be a project involving people of good will. It would be desirable to get this done prior to the 2020 winter season.

I am very pleased to say that in restructuring the Association we have been able to assemble the following sub committees:

- Representative Teams (Sharks) subcommittee capably led by Lynette
 Williams and Rachael Frost with involvement by Alan Climpson. This
 subcommittee have been tasked with having the Sharks work as a de facto
 club. The results this year have been very good. The Women's teams did not
 retain Premier League status. The Men also did not achieve Premier League
 status despite a very strong showing.
 - Well done to all involved and we look forward to positive times over the next couple of years maybe even next year for some.
- Competition/Match Committee Chaired by Alan Climpson aided by Secretary Claire Barnes. The committee has met a number of times this year and have effectively run the local competition. Some aspects are less than ideal however have been able to be managed. Nothing a few more senior teams, especially Men, could not resolve.

3. Junior Recruitment and Retention – This subcommittee acts as a forum for ideas and support. I chair this group and have been heartened by the interest of many people in this area. In my view it is one of the most important aspects of our game. If we do not get this right there will possibly be no local competition. And no Sharks either.

For this past year Hockey Victoria handed over control of the program in full for the Geelong area. The forum has met and discussed ways to maximise the resources we have, especially finances and have been very successful I believe.

We have also looked at alternative program including Sporting Schools, partnering with schools and becoming part of after school programs. Hockey Victoria has also agreed for GHA to run programs in 2020. Details are not yet finalised.

4. I see a need for a further few sub committees which we will strive to create and resource. These include Strategy and Strategic Planning, Events and Governance (which is being handles by the Executive at this time).

In terms of our exposure outside Geelong our Sharks teams have represented well. Sometimes without the outcomes they desired however always with humility and good sportsmanship. Thank You to all involved including coaches, managers, players and often parents who are unsung champions.

Locally our numbers have been down a bit this year. I hope this is just part of a cycle we see from time to time. But it is a wake-up call to all of us that we cannot drop the ball with recruiting.

Our local competition was well run this year culminating in some realty good matches on Grand Final day. To all those who played, all those who played in finals games and all of those who participated in the season you are to be congratulated on your respective performances.

As we look forward.....A number of interlinked issues are confronting us in the near future.

This begins with the surface of pitch 1 which has now been in use for 11 years. We are advised, and it is visually clear, that it is reaching end of life. We expect this to be a \$400K+ project to replace. We would hope to get some assistance from City of Greater Geelong (CoGG) and by way of grants. In preparing for this asset replacement we are

commencing a process of development of a formal Business Plan in conjunction with Leisure Networks. By the time you read this the first meeting will have been held and the process will be well underway. Many people will have been or will be invited to participate in the process.

There are so many other smaller issues that have been resolved or are still being worked on. There is still much to do. I wish the new committee well in their endeavours. I hope to be part of that journey with you.

Vale Peter O'Reilly

Peter became involved with Stead Park's Hockey complex in the early 90's. In 1994 Peter O'Reilly worked on the plan and design for the current hockey pavilion's first stage, consisting of toilets, change room, meeting room, main room and canteen. Prior to this the players used the old toilet block and clubrooms which were located where softball rooms are currently. Whilst not far away they were considered inconvenient and in times of inclement weather of no use to players or spectators what so ever. Initially, beside the new synthetic pitch the shelter on grand final day consisted of a tent.

In 1995 construction commenced on the new club house. In endeavour to minimise cost this process was managed by Hockey (Peter O'Reilly), one of the first organisations to do so as the City of Greater Geelong council is generally reluctant to let go of this process. Peter in conjunction with Max Findlay put the building together, it was a concrete prefabricated design. The roof was installed one weekend with volunteers from the Association and supervised by John Stephenson and Peter. Association funds were tight, and the building was completed by members of the association (who were volunteered, rostered and shanghaied) to finish off various works, in particular the painting.

To complete the building was a strain, volunteers initially were abundant but as time went on became fewer. It was a huge drain and a few people including Peter O'Reilly, John Stephenson, Greg Stephenson, David Burns and Jim Kirk spent long hours almost every night of the week painting. This building was truly built by Peter O'Reilly and John Stephenson.

In hind sight the Association should have found extra money to build the club rooms, but we had nothing, and this was the only way to complete the building.

In 2002 Peter was again involved when stage two of the building was designed and installed. Stage two consisted of an extension to the North end of the existing building which was an office, first aid and club storage facilities. More painting involved!! 2006 saw the strategic Review conducted by the Association and member clubs facilitated by Sue McCormack, an important step in determining the direction and focus of facilities which led to the second ground being established at Stead Park. 2007 Peter was awarded Geelong Hockey Association Life Membership. 2008 Replacement surface on Pitch One, this work included the fence and drainage and liaison with turf manufacturers and suppliers. This process was co-ordinated by Peter. A master Plan was being developed for Stead Park by the sporting user groups, the major groups being softball, hockey and soccer. Peter was involved is this, and as a result commenced work on the plans for the establishment of the second synthetic ground.


2009 Murray Stand Constructed, again with Peter's design and input.

THE HON SECRETARY & TREASURER'S REPORT 2018-2019

THE SECRETARY'S REPORT

- The Annual Statements required by Consumer Affairs were brought up to date and lodged.
 There had been a problem with CAV not accepting the 2016 & 2017 annual statements
- The transition of the Working with Children Register to link via Hockey Victoria through to the Department of Justice remains work in progress

THE TREASURER'S REPORT

INCOME

- Extra funds received from Hockey Victoria for Road Shows and Junior development for a total of \$20,000. The committee has set aside \$3,000 of these funds for improving the skills of junior umpires and coaches in 2020
- HG Sharks had success with gaining sponsors with one major sponsor donating \$15,000, plus several other sponsorships. This has greatly assisted the financing of the senior & junior Rep Teams

EXPENSES

- A provision for Long Service Leave was taken up this year for two part time employees increasing the wage costs by \$8,653
- A balance sheet journal adjustment was entered to rectify a MYOB roll over mistake from several years ago and is recorded as a negative in miscellaneous income

SUMMARY

- Compared to last year a net profit of \$18,407.07 vs \$15,164.62 was achieved when the LSL provision was added back in.
- Cash flow was positive and an extra \$1,500 per month was paid off against the Bendigo Loan
- The Term Deposit No 2 was topped up in August by \$14,000
- The accounting software has been moved to MYOB on-line, so the Association is compliant for recording payroll and superannuation transactions with the ATO.

I wish to thank Ian Sayers for his support as Assistant Treasurer during the year. Gordon Burns for keeping accurate records for the hire of the facilities.

Junior Coaching and Skills Clinics

JUNIOR DEVELOPMENT

In March, Hockey Geelong Junior Sharks took receipt of a Bola ball machine on behalf of the Association. This was the result of fund-raising, Just Hockey Sponsorship and a successful grant in 2018 from Geelong Connected Communities.

Following the success of last year's inaugural U14 Boys Development Program, we ran a 7-week programme with coaching assistance and expertise from Deb and Matt Barnett. This program was first offered to the unsuccessful U14 Junior Shark Rep trialists and then targeted invited club players. In total 13 boys participated in the program.

2019 JUNIOR COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIPS

At the conclusion of the U14 Boys Development program the eligible players went on to compete as an U13 team in the Junior Country Champs – with assistance from several rep players and a few club players.

We also entered an U15 Boys team, made up from mostly U14 and U16 Junior Sharks and a few club players to round out the numbers.

This was the first time in many years that we have been able to enter 2 teams in the JCC – so we are pleased the development program has gathered the required support and produced quality outcomes.

GOAL-KEEPER DEVELOPMENT

A 6-week goal-keeper program was run towards the end of the season with 10 participants led by several senior goalkeepers. It was pleasing to see the skills improve from week to week. It was especially pleasing to see 10-year-old Mai Lorenzen be selected as Train-on GK for the Vic U13 Girls squad during the program.

Grounds and Safety

The 2019 year has not been so overtly facilities focussed but a lot of background work has been going on.

Reading last year's report, the garden bed was mentioned. This is still a work in progress. This has been a deliberate decision due to the very dry weather conditions we have experienced. We still hope to have this completed shortly as we need to "bite the bullet"

Last year's report also mentioned a second defibrillator. This is now regularly deployed at both games and training. It has been added to a mobile first aid kit which is also deployed. We continue to have issues around stocking of the kit. It would be much easier if anyone who needs supplies would replenish the kit from stock in the First Aid room. We continue to do our best.

Electronic score boards were installed in the past couple of years. However, they were not without their challenges. One major issue was the use of temporary power feeds to run the score boards. At various time either or both boards were not working. An exercise this year was undertaken to permanently wire the boards which has had the effect of making them more reliable. Tick that one off the list!!

A continuing problem exists with meeting liquor licensing laws. We have little if any problems with drinking in and around the site. Compliance with the law is the issue. After some research we need to clean up our compliance. Accordingly, work is being done to apply for a new license for the Stead Park hockey facility. Currently you are not "allowed" to take alcohol to pitch 2 however we know this does occur. We will be attempting to set up both "wet" (red line) and "dry" areas to address these issues. This may take a while as there are many players to involve but must be done as the fines for noncompliance are very heavy.

Outside of Stead Park we need to recognise that work is underway at Torquay to build a synthetic pitch. This will not be "owned" by the GHA however will allow for home and away matches for Torquay HC. It is expected this may be available for use in 2-3years.

Some of you will also be aware that this year we were offered synthetic surface from the State Netball Hockey Centre rebuild. A tremendous amount of intensive work was put in over a relatively short time period (March until September 2019) to try to make use of this carpet. A proposal was put to Golden Plains Shire which would have benefitted Golden Plains HC. Unfortunately, time beat us. There simply was not enough time between notification and need to remove the carpet from site at Parkville. This was not a problem which we could do anything about. Clearly it was a communications issue

between the project team, Hockey Victoria and ourselves with blame if any residing with the SNHC project team. A real shame.

Both of these projects are/were directly linked to the recently endorsed G21 Hockey Strategy for Geelong.

With another winter season over, the Hockey Geelong Executive cannot rest. In the blink of an eye a new season will be staring. The committee members have many ideas to improve hockey in the Geelong region, not just Stead Park. The Strategic Planning document which has recently commenced could be used to address many of these issues including, especially, replacement of the surface on pitch 1 at Stead Park which has now seen 11 seasons of use. It is beyond its design life but will need to do at least one more season it seems.

And finally, this report would not be complete if time was not set aside to thank Gordon Burns. Gordon does much more than anyone who just attends Stead Park would know working behind the scenes taking care of the grounds and facilities upkeep. It is fair to say that Gordon takes ownership and pride in the facility with work done in a timely manner by Gordon.

On behalf of the committee and the all users of Stead Park - Thank you Gordon!

Hockey Geelong Competition report

The Hockey Geelong Junior and Senior Competitions for the 2019 winter season provided some excellent performances, and very competitive matches. This was particularly evident for the Junior competitions as the U12, U14 and U17 Grand Finals all went to extra time in order to determine the Premiers for the year.

The total number of teams entered across all the competitions was reduced in 2019. This was disappointing, given the significant amount of work which Hockey Geelong and its affiliated clubs had put into efforts to recruit new members. Co-operation between some clubs allowed them to enter combined teams and retain members who may otherwise have been lost to the sport.

The lower number of teams entered at the U8 level was especially disappointing after a number of years where recruiting at this level was very pleasing. It was good to see a team entered from Saints Hockey Club, but low player numbers continued to be a problem for some teams. This may

be related to the unsuccessful attempts to organise roadshows and school visits which occurred for 2019.

The U10 competition proved exciting right to the last round, with the Premiers and Runners Up separated only by a narrow margin. As is the procedure with the U10 competition, there are no finals, and the Premiership is awarded to the team which finishes on top of the ladder at the end of the home and away season. Congratulations to Torquay Hockey Club.

Due to the number of players available, the U17 age group was again offered, rather than an U16 and u18. This larger spread of players is not ideal but still offers the opportunity for players who are not ready for senior competition to continue playing. An extra team in this division this year provided some variety in the competition. Congratulations to Geelong who claimed the Premiership, re-entering this division after some years out.

The senior men's competition was reorganised after round 3 due to the withdrawal of 1 team from

Division 1, leaving only 3 teams remaining. The 11 teams nominated for both Division 1 and Division 2 played a combined season, and then played finals within their nominated divisions. While there were some significant disparities in the scores, the system generally worked well to make the best of the current situation.

The G21 Regional Hockey Strategy recommended that the development of a Business Case for a Multipurpose Hockey Facility as a critical priority. Council included the development of the Business Case in the 2019/2020 budget and this is anticipated to be completed early in 2020.

The Torquay Hockey Club also partnered with Hockey Australia to provide an afterschool hockey program at Moriac Primary School with over 30 children participating. The club also had roadshows in March at the majority of Surf Coast Schools including Moriac. We hope that some of the Moriac community will become active playing members in 2020.

One challenge that the Torquay Hockey Club had in 2019 was meeting umpiring commitments. Our club is very concerned that the current model for umpiring at Hockey Geelong is not sustainable. We intend to work with Hockey Geelong to help develop a new model for 2020 that is based on looking after the umpires as volunteers and improving the quality for the competition.

Umpire's Report

This year I continued with the Umpire Coordinators role.

The parameters were continued from last year, to provide an umpire from each club for each team that was fielded.

This was made difficult as some clubs either did not have enough or only provided the minimum number of umpires.

It is noted that Torquay club provided the least number of umpires for the positions to be filled.

The clubs that provided more umpires than they required gave me the ability to back fill positions caused from injury, Hockey Victoria "Sharks games", or outside commitments, making the rostering straightforward.

There is also a requirement to get the umpires who have completed the theory training to be shadowed and signed off as umpires. As an association we cannot raise the standard if we are not even at the starting line.

Next year it would be good for the clubs to actively recruit umpires to bolster the numbers. Starting in the junior ranks, but more critically in the seniors. Ideally, if we could get twice the number of umpires each club required, then they would only need to umpire every second week. There are a few who are happy to umpire every week, who are motivated either by the pocket money or the being involved. There are still some who are only umpiring "because no one else will and the game will be cancelled if they don't". Clubs need to get some of the players to step up and help. If we do not have enough umpires, we cannot run the competition.

From my perspective the way that we communicated and got the roster finalised on the whole worked well. It fell down when we had 3 or more umpires out for various reasons from one club. When clubs have a lot more qualified umpires within, but I only have a limited number of contacts this makes it difficult to backfill!

One suggestion for the committee to decide on is that maybe Shadow umpires should also get paid. This year we did try and recruit as many as we could. This meant there were a number of umpires who were playing, umpiring and then shadowing all in the same afternoon.

I would like to thank the Newtown for stepping up and providing so many umpires to fill gaps when we were short. This helped enormously.

Umpiring suggestions for next year:

- 1. Modify the Association Rules so that when a club enters a team into the senior competition, they are required to register an umpire and that clubs also need to provide a "spare" registered umpire for every 3 teams.
- 2. Recruitment drive within the clubs. Either trying to get new or already qualified to step in. If there are enough numbers it means those who don't want to do it every week don't have to, but it takes the pressure off everyone else.
- 3. Look at paying the shadows at least something. Especially when they were doing so much.

Finally, I would like to thank Peter Stuart for his support during a difficult season.

Coaching clinics are always great, with lots of kids attending and receiving some specialised coaching.

Thursday night dinners have proved to be an amazing success. Lots of the players stayed around and enjoyed the food, and it created a great environment for people to feel part of the club.

This year saw the addition of a volunteer levy. The thought behind this was to get more people to help around the club rather than the same few people doing all the work. Those that helped were refunded the levy amount. I'm not sure how successful this was, but it was a trial, and if used again there would be clearer guidelines.

There was a massive amount of work done behind the scenes to secure some sponsorship for the Hockey Geelong Sharks. This saw a change in uniform, and also supplier to accommodate the sponsor's name being applied to the playing strip. These sponsors were *Tdl precision orthodontics, Indigo Wolf, Peak Pharmacy* and *Aqua Maternity*. The League entry criteria document (LEC) is a continual focus. We are aiming for our senior groups to be eligible for Premier League in the future. This requires quite a bit of

Preparation for season 2019 started way back in October 2018 after a strong first year in Premier League. Our next points came from a win against Essendon at home, trailing on the scoreboard 3-1 with 10 minutes to go, we managed to stun Essendon and score 3 goals in 4 minutes to take the lead. Holding on for our first win of the season and we were all very relieved. The last 4 games were mixed results with one draw against Powerhouse, a close loss to Yarra Valley and two tougher losses to Footscray and Hawthorn who eventually finished Premiers and Runner up.

This was clearly our toughest season in my time (5 years) involved and a real eye opener for everyone who was part of this resilient group. Hopefully this drives the playing group with a better understanding of what is needed consistently at this level to be competitive into the future. The 2019 Junior Sharks had a fantastic season and I know the whole Geelong hockey community joins me in congratulating all our Junior Sharks. The Sharks' Representative teams provide a pathway for all Geelong juniors wanting to develop their hockey skills and play at the highest level available in Victoria.

The Sharks aim to ensure a culture that:

- Performing tackles that would allow a second attempt so to remove one time tackling.

Midfield consisted of a hard working fast-paced outfit. Highly skilled individually it was important to get them focused on moving the ball around at pace.

- Goals for this part of the team was to work on cycling leads to create gaps for other midfielders to run into
- Protecting the ball when receiving and carrying so that opposition cannot tackle.
- Organising the forward press structure, executing team tackling, and shut downs of plays through the midfield.
- Being able to do the hard yards early to help the defence or strikers.

Some experienced players and promising new members headed the strike line. It was important for them to realise that a slow transition from between attack and defence either way can greatly affect the team.

U16 Boys – Shield B Competition

- Goals for this team was to provide various different press largely keeping them from entering the middle of the pitch and isolating opposition defenders.
- Attacking with width and depth and creating enough space for the midfield to work in
- Rotating the forward line structure to create space for other strikers and mess with opposition defensive structures.

Throughout the season, the pursuit of these goals gave us some very strong outcomes to top of the table teams. These tactics relied heavily on every player contributing to their roles and understanding the game plan.

Individual skills of players were highlighted as important, focusing on the basic passes, receiving the ball in a strong position and tackling efficiently so as not to be eliminated once a tackle was made.


