Vale Ronda Braybrook - Life Member


5 July 1943 to 11 March 2015

Treasurer's Report

THE TREASURER'S REPORT - 2014/2015 FINANCIAL YEAR

The year's objective was to consolidate the finances of the Association after several years of confusion with accounting package changes.

The transfer of the accounts from the former Treasurer took place late January 2015 and I wish to thank Mark Ruseler for his help with the transfer and also the Assistant Treasurer, Ian Sayers, for his knowledge and ongoing support during the year.

The accounts for the financial year ending on 30/9/2015 at the time of writing are being audited.

Loans were reduced by \$18,321.95 for the year

Net cash position, including all bank accounts, deposits & bank loans, improved by \$24,483.75

With Player registrations and insurance fees being paid to Hockey Victoria, comparisons to the previous year were difficult. Detailed ledger allocations from the previous year were not available, only the final balances at the end of the year.

Key points -

- Income increased by \$10,759.56, sponsorship, fundraising, uniform sales and event income were the main contributors
- Canteen Sales were down by \$12,845.60 compared to the previous year
- Expenses included the hit up area storm damage repair cost.
- Electricity expense was up but included \$6,008 from last year
- Other income included the insurance refund for repairs to the hit up area.
- The trading loss for the year is (\$5,280.11) vs last year's loss of (\$22,656.81) before write offs.
- Depreciation increased with a full year's deduction taken up for Pitch No 2
- Cash flow earnings for the year were \$72,178.98 vs last year \$37,055.36
- Canteen made a net profit of \$12,012.13 after expenses & wages.

Resolutions

- 1. "The Annual General Meeting of the Association approves the Auditor, Carl Nunan & Associates, be appointed for 2015/2016 financial year"
- 2. "The annual membership fee for the Association for the 2015/2016 financial year be set at
 - a) Seniors \$5.00 per senior player 18 years of age and older
 - b) Juniors \$2.00 per player from the U13 competition up to the age of 18"

Junior Recruiting/Development

The aim of this forum is to keep focus on recruiting of new players to the sport of hockey. To achieve this outcome the clubs are invited to attend, share knowledge and give input to the process. The clubs are ultimately responsible for their own recruiting whether via their own club efforts or in conjunction with other bodies including Hockey Victoria via road shows.

At the time of writing there have been 6 meetings of this forum where some positive outcomes have been observed.

These include:

- A database of schools allocated to Clubs. While it is acknowledged this is not perfect it is as agreed by the Clubs that were participating up to the point where the boundaries were drawn. This document will need review.
- A focus by Saints hockey club in the Lara schools.
- A face to face meeting with Eliza Caldecott, Hockey Victoria Area Development manager and Club representatives.
- Registration with Sporting Schools
- A program run at Holy Family school under Sporting Schools
- A program about to commence at Winchelsea primary school for Golden Plains hockey Club.
- A meeting being organised with Hockey Victoria and local clubs to discuss and fully understand the road show process for early 2016.
- Programs run by Geelong Hockey Club which are showing some really positive signs.
- Good recruiting numbers at Newtown Hockey Club where various programs including evening Come'n'Try's are attracting players
- Fledgling interest from Corio Hockey Club which needs to be nurtured.

I hope this is only the beginning of a journey in which all Clubs will participate. There is so much that I believe is still to be explored and tried.

Ultimately it is up to the local Clubs to make a successful future for themselves.

Grounds and Safety

2015 winter season kicked off with the annual working bee where all local clubs and HG were required to nominate 2 people to help HG committee clean up the Stead Park. There were many small jobs on the list; more noticeably the small meeting. The room has been cleared to allow it to become more spacious and functional as a result.

Hockey Geelong was fortunate enough to obtain a grant to help fund 16 participants in successfully obtaining their Applied First Aid certificates.

This year saw the trial of all clubs utilising the first aid room instead of having to supply their own kits during the winter season. All clubs where asked to pay a nominal fee to cover the cost of the first aid supplies used. This was warmly received and seemed to work relatively well. Things to improve on next year would be an item use booklet. This would ensure stock can be replaced in a timely manner and to give the committee more of an idea of frequently used items. The plan moving forward is to purchase a new more functional first aid cabinet for the first aid room. We also intend to purchase a new cabinet to be placed in the middle of the pitches (most likely situated in the tech bench dugout) for easy access to the players on the 2nd pitch. A freezer was placed in the tech bench dugout to make sure we had ice available in a timely manner for anyone unfortunate enough to need it.

New signage is in the process of being bought to better display first aid areas as well as safe evacuations areas should the need ever arrive.

For the observant bunch amongst us, you will have notice the BBQ/seating area has had a face lift. Through the hard work of Scott Walters, Jason Bingham, Alan Climpson and Gordon the area has now been converted in too much needed extra change rooms. If I have failed to mention others that contributed to this project, I sincerely apologise. Along with the new rooms we have also obtained new tables and chairs for the outside areas for all to utilise.

For the frequent flyers of Stead Park you will notice that things are kept in pretty good working order, lawns mowed, minor repairs attended to and the general running of the park taking place relatively unnoticed. No, the fairies don't come in and wave a magic wand to keep Stead Park running. A large part of the work is completed by Gordon. However, there are many people behind the scenes lending a hand and volunteering their time. People like Alan Climpson, Nette Williams, Terry Moore, and Pam Sutton to name a few. This has allowed Hockey Geelong to host many special events throughout the season, with what appears to be with little effort. I am well aware there are many others who have helped out, ensuring a successful 2015 season on and off the pitch and acknowledge I may have failed to mention you all individually, but would like to say a BIG THANK YOU!



From a panel of umpires provided by clubs, umpires were rostered to all senior home and away games and both junior and senior finals during the 2015 winter season.

At times due to limited availability, some umpires had to be rostered to at least 3 games on a weekend. Those umpires who play and umpire were often very busy juggling their commitments.

It is essential that clubs continue to train new umpires and support their development towards umpiring in the senior competition, so we may expand the panel of available umpires and avoid umpire burnout.

The umpire coaching provided by experienced umpires at these tournaments needs to be utilised by all umpires to assist in their continued development, to achieve umpire accreditation, and improve the standard of umpiring in Geelong.

Hockey Victoria also provides umpire development opportunities at the junior state tournaments and umpires are encouraged to pursue these opportunities.

We have had umpires at Zone Challenge, JCC, JSC and at national tournaments throughout the year.

The Hockey Geelong competition benefits when these umpires bring their expertise back to Geelong and provide umpire coaching to our developing umpires.

We had 1 umpire participate in the HV umpire Academy. As a VL1 association, this is a requirement for our Hockey Geelong Representative teams to compete without penalty.

Hockey Victoria Competition Men's Vic League 1

Preseason got off to a solid start this year with reasonable numbers presenting both prior to and after the Christmas break. Pre-season games were organised against a combination of Premier League and VL1 sides. Not only was this work a chance to get the players fit and thinking about the coming season, but also to see what our playing stocks looked like and get a picture of the squads we would be looking to field. It is pertinent to state that the pre-season preparation was significantly compromised by budgetary constraints. With a constant thought back to the cost of hiring our own pitch we were forced to limit the number of pre-season on-field sessions that we undertook. It is difficult to quantify the impact that this had on the season itself — however at the very least it did not allow us to fully develop our game-style or game plans for the opening rounds of the competition. With such limited opportunities to garner promotion at this level, it is disappointing that these compromises needed to be made.

The season itself presented some significant challenges. The unavailability of Andrew Smith to continue his work with the group was significant. I cannot understate the excellent work that Smithy has done for the club and by default the association. Andrew has left an indelible imprint on this team – playing style, skill base, game knowledge and perhaps most significantly culture. His involvement has not only improved the results the club has experienced but has lifted the profile of Hockey Geelong throughout the wider Victorian Hockey community. Whilst his involvement was limited this year I constantly used his knowledge and experience to bounce ideas off and greatly enjoyed his contribution. I hope that the Hockey Geelong Association sees the value in the investment they made in Andrew.

Smithy's absence was compounded by the retirement of a two of our most experienced players – Grant Downie, Andrew Taylor – which not only depleted the team of invaluable experience but also 3 of our top goal scorers. We also lost the services of our Goalie (Ben Champion – study abroad) and promising young full-back Luke Kelly (back to local). The (re-)recruitment of Jack Chadwick and Keith Hutchison, plus goalie Cam Montgomery helped to cover some of the holes as did the late recruitment of Lachlan Carey.

In regards to Lachie – this was a player who had come to the region with significant hockey pedigree, having played in both Albury and Newcastle. Having relocated to Geelong for work he started playing local hockey – which for a player of his skill was well below the level he was both capable of and had played in the past. We were lucky enough to hear about him through other local hockey players and after an approach he was almost relieved that there was a higher level of hockey that he could participate in. Whilst I understand that local clubs have an intrinsic desire to hold onto players of Lachie's calibre – it is disappointing that at no stage did any of the clubs approached suggest that he could play in Vic League.

I am of the distinct opinion that having a successful and prominent Vic League presence has positive implications to the entire Hockey Geelong community. This is but an example of where the local clubs are able to help the development and playing stocks of the representative teams. Too often there seems to be a conflict between the desire of the local clubs to have "their" players in their ranks versus representing the association. Whilst this enmity continues, it is difficult for the representative team to truly reach its potential and further elevate the stature of Hockey in Geelong.

From a hockey point of view the season was one of what "could have been". With a reshuffled line-up we took time to find our feet, even though the systems were mirrored from the previous year's work. The compromised draw, which saw some teams played only once did not help our cause, particularly as we seemed to come up against the highest ranked teams on their home turfs — a significant disadvantage when you consider we remained undefeated at Stead Park for another season. A dropped game against Kew and draws against both Frankston and Old Xavs, were definitely lost opportunities. Still we finished a commendable 3rd after the regular season — the same position as last year. A solid win against Frankston in the elimination final put us up against MUHC — the minor premiers. A close battle ensued where we were pipped at the post by 5-4. The mood in the rooms told the story of a team that truly believed they should have pushed on for a 3rd consecutive grand final.

In terms of player development we were able to blood a number of younger players into the team with Zed Armistead, Sean Fitzgerald, Gus McKinnon, Loki Whyte, Nick Hackwell and Lyndon Springthorpe all making their senior first team debuts. It would have been preferred to have given additional opportunities to these players through the season — however with the aforementioned changes in team personnel it was difficult to find the right opportunities.

Going into next year the team and association will find itself at a cross-roads. It is likely that some of our most promising players will be lost to Premier League clubs — as they seek to extend their skills into the highest level on offer. I don't think that we can deny them their desire to make this change. Instead we should relish the fact that we have been able to retain them as long as we have and have played a significant role in their hockey development. In speaking to them and others that have left previously I know that if Geelong does make the promotion to Premier League that these players will be the first to put up their hands to be considered for selection.

This should also be seen as a great opportunity for the younger players to transition into this team. We have great talent coming through the ranks – not only the players mentioned above but also – Liam Kerr-Nelson, Matt Barnett and Adam Gieles to name three. I hope that they get the support and resources that they need in order to make the transition to the VL1 team and that the association continues to invest in the development of these and other aspiring players to reach their full potential.

Finally — a big thank you to Bron Kelly whose work in the background as team manager always went above and beyond. The amazing support that she bought to the team made my life (as well as those of the players) so much easier and a little less stressful. Also thanks to Simone Armistead for helping out Bron on game day, Gordon for putting up with all the little requests I had and Andrew Smith for all the feedback, ideas and support throughout the season. Assistant Coach Report Women's Vic League 1

2015 for the Hockey Geelong women was going to be a challenging one after several senior players decided to move on, early on in the preseason our numbers looked low. With a couple of new appointments to the coaching panel we hoped to invigorate the playing group. We put the word out that we were looking for commitment from players who were contemplating their future with us and had some great honest replies. This showed us that we needed to top up our playing list with a few new players and promote some young players. Over the past few seasons there have been several young players who have showed good promise and they were going to get an opportunity this year.

Pre season training attendance was up and down as far as numbers were concerned but there were a few who were at almost every session and this was forming the core for our Vic League team. With some new talent coming through and some people stepping up and showing great leadership potential we were excited by what the season could bring.

We had several practice games over the preseason and again this started slowly for us with things looking like they were going to take a while to gel. After few practice games we started to see some real potential within this group and they were starting to look like a team.

We headed into round 1 v Southern under no illusions as to how big a challenge this would be. Unfortunately we were soundly beaten on the day and this was a big reality check for us all. From here we had a big task to get the ladies up for the next game against last year's finalist in MUHC. We came out with great intent in this game and showed we can match it with the best, earning out first point for the season with a draw in an away game v a top 4 side.

After a positive game against MUHC in round 2, round 3 saw us get our first win for the season against La Trobe. This was a positive start to the season for this group that had worked hard over the preseason.

The next 6 round saw us get some more points having 2 wins, a draw and 3 losses. While we were sitting down the ladder a bit at this point we were still in touch with the top 4. Unfortunately our second half of the year was not as strong as it should have been and this saw us drop to 8th position on the ladder at the competition of the home and away rounds.

There were several contributing factors to our inconsistent form this season including a huge amount of player unavailability due to injury, illness, work, higher representative duties and a wedding (or two). At one stage we had 9 of what would have been our regular ones players unavailable.

To the playing groups credit they stayed positive and faced every challenge that was put in front of them. With many players unavailable for many games this presented great opportunity for some of our younger players to step up as they continued to develop their hockey. We saw several junior players cement their spot in the ones over the year as well as a few who stepped up from the twos and hold their positions as well. As a coaching group we decided not to rely on past players coming back to help out the ones too much and give the opportunity to our younger players.

While not getting the results we may have wanted along the way we believe that this experience for our younger players was very valuable and will hold us in good stead moving forward as a playing group.

Our round 17 game was a highlight for us even though it was a loss. We travelled to Mornington minus about 7 of our regular players and our head coach to take on the rampant Mornington ladies. The game ended up as a bit of a shoot out and our girls showed great resilience to stay in it. We managed to score 4 goals in that game against a final 4 side with several of our younger girls playing pivotal roles across the ground. Not a win but it felt pretty good to see the girls respond like they did.

Overall the results for us were not what we would have liked and we were far too inconsistent over the season. But with a big focus on changing the culture of this group, developing our up and coming younger players and giving them opportunities as well as bringing some positivity into the playing group I feel like we managed to achieve these things fairly well.

I do believe that this group of ladies has a lot of promise moving forward and I am genuinely excited by the future I can see. I feel that our focus needs to be on recruiting a couple of players to bolster the defense and a genuine striker as well as the continuing development of our players. We must challenge them all to strive to better themselves and this includes the coaching group as well.

It is important that we offer some extra development opportunities to this group over the off season and hit the ground running next season.

We used a total of 28 players in the firsts and 30 players in the reserves. This shows me that we had a very unsettled year. Looking forward I'm not sure how we address this but it is something that needs closer attention if we are serious about pushing for a Premier League spot.

Overall I have really enjoyed to opportunity to coach this great group of ladies in season 2015 and would like to thank Hockey Geelong for their support, looking forward to 2016.

Women's Vic League 1 Reserves

Season Overview

Pre-Season

Pre-season commenced with genuine enthusiasm and promise in terms of player attendance to the initial sessions; which eventually tapered towards the beginning of the season, specifically relating to the fitness sessions; however a positive 'feel' and 'spirit' of the group was strong. Clear leadership indicators within the squad were prevalent through the experienced players from prior years; who were clearly showing their worth in this area. As the pre-season practice games commenced, it was evident that the majority of this experience would be present in the Reserves squad for 2015. A balanced mix of youth with this experience would hold the group in good-stead and a top four finish should be achievable despite significant personnel changes to the previous year (where the team played finals).

Rounds 1-6; (3 wins, 2 losses, 1 draw)

Scratchy start to the season with heavy losses to eventual grand finalists in the first two rounds. The team rebounded well and won the next three games, scoring heavily with 18 goals in these games. Round 6 was the first of three costly games where we drew to Mornington (1-1) after going down to ten players after the first 15 minutes. Expectations of at least 4 wins after 6 rounds was not met.

Rounds 7-12; (4 wins, 2 losses)

The Round 7 win against Yarra in very ordinary conditions set the tone and expectations for the season, in an extremely spirited effort by all players! Another 16 goals in rounds 7-9 had the group buoyant and heading towards a top-four result. Losses to Blazers and Powerhouse followed with team personnel shortages disrupting the groups' momentum. A return-bout victory against Blazers (away from home) within the space of three weeks, positioned the side well leading into the final third of the season. Expectation of 4 wins from this group of 6 games was achieved.

Rounds 13-18; (4 wins, 1 loss, 1 draw)

Possibly the most disappointing game of the season at Latrobe losing 3-4 in round 13 turned out extremely costly. It did however send a clear message to the group about the importance of not deviating from consistent game preparation, consistency of effort and the necessary requirements of defensive pressure acts all over the ground. The group responded well in Round 14, and should have won in Round 15 against Southern; where we conceded with 2 minutes to go, finishing with a draw. The team finished the season with three strong wins including an away win in Round 18 against Powerhouse. The final third of the season whilst successful in some aspects with four wins; was also unsatisfactory, missing out on maximum premiership points.

Form was extremely good and it was apparent that the team were one of the better sides in the competition by seasons-end.

As the season transpired, when the group arrived organised to the game and prepared well, a positive performance followed (and vice versa). In addition, the level of respect amongst the playing group was evident and grew throughout the year. Often within a playing group there will be division in playing beliefs, which can lead to disruption. This turned out to be less evident as the season went on.

Individual player development in a team setting was apparent, however not to the desired expectations; which may have been the consequence of training attendance deterioration and program structure (refer *Future Training Program* suggestions).

Team mechanics evolved strongly throughout the season. Results along with relative game-day performances would indicate that we were close to the second best side in the competition. Unfortunately the identified 'costly games' did not allow the group to prove this point during a finals campaign.

Areas of Improvement

Managing a Reserves playing roster can be difficult to maintain stability and consistency, with players transitioning in and out of the side through promotion/demotion, or through general unavailability. The squad's depth was subsequently tested several times in this regard in 2015, and Club would benefit from improved linkages to the Junior program and Regional local competition.

Defensively at times the Reserves team lacked composure in possession and failed to transition out of defensive areas with regularity; at times costing goals.

The work-rate of many of the senior team members was commonly evident, however less consistently with our inexperienced players. By seasons end however, it was apparent that an understanding of the necessary requirements at the level, registered amongst all players; which will hold the club in good stead in future years.

Coaching Structure Observations

The coaching group worked well together for the most part, with each coach having only minor varying views of hockey style, positional structures, player development and training drills. Suggest in future terms that greater emphasis be spent on <u>planning</u> the pre-season and training programs in advance as suggested below:

Future Pre-season suggestions -

- Emphasis on fitness and ball skill development in unison. This method of preseason training has proven to be successful in similar sports such as elite soccer; whereby aerobic development is combined with ball routines.
- Nominate compulsory sessions and related programs at the commencement of pre-season. This may improve on the professionalism and attendance expectations of the group/Club.
- Engage juniors and Regional/Local players at this juncture.

Future Training program suggestions -

- Training skeleton planned two (2) weeks in advance; as well as allowing for moderate change
- Greater emphasis on individual skill development. For example, identifying individual areas for improvement and allocating one coach to common skill and technique development for a defined period; opposed to incidental identification & rectification of inadequacies.
- Interview players at the commencement of the season to discuss skill/technique improvement areas and put in place a personal development program.
- Skill-based education on session ONE of each week.
- Team-based education on session TWO of each week.
- Engage the leadership group in training programs at regular intervals, to increase buy-in and engagement levels

• Finally, display the nights training program on a portable white-board at the start of training, for all team members to view and understand. Expectations are then set and the session will flow well and be soundly constructed.

The season finished off with presentation night, which was well organised by the events committee. The event was held at the Geelong RSL with a two course meal. A great night was had by all. Presentations were made for Coaches Awards, Most Valuable Players and Best and Fairest for each Division. Masters teams were well represented and awards were also made to players in a number of categories.

This year the representative teams committee worked very hard but we did find with only four members the work load was significant and quite hectic. The committee members were Rachael Frost, Lynette Williams, Terry Moore and Fergus Dawson.

Miscommunications and incorrect advice from HV saw us scrambling for players at the last minute to participate in the Under 16 Mixed Shield grading carnival. The team played well, but was unfortunately unsuccessful in gaining a Shield spot. The team gave a solid season's performance in Under 16 Pennant North West division, making it through to the Finals series, going down.

The Under 16 Girls gained a berth in the Shield competition, as HV's stance was any club nomination for girls' Shield was automatically granted. This saw 11 teams in this 14-round competition; meaning all teams played each other once, then a rating system saw each team play 3 other teams twice.

The Under 14 Girls and U14 Mixed played in Pennant grades.

Hockey Geelong junior reps finished the season with 2 teams making it through to the finals series: Under 14 Girls Pennant and Under 16 Mixed Pennant NW. The opportunity to be able to showcase young female officials in such high profile roles helps serve the promotion of Women in Sport and show the pathways possible. Courtney undertook the role with great passion and dedication and in my opinion has a great future in this area of sports administration.

To my Assistant Tournament Director Gina Smith thanks for the huge effort you put in over the weekend, Gina worked tirelessly each day, this made my role a breeze and thanks to this, I was able to leave running of the tournament in her capable hands, this I see as a great chance for development of both individuals but also the hockey community. For both the opportunity to work towards attaining her Level 1 Technical Official accreditation was a major component of the weekend and one they can take forward in new roles and opportunities at other events and tournaments.

To all the volunteers for Hockey Geelong that manned the Canteen and ensured the facility was cleaned during the day please accept my thanks.

To our First Aid Officer Coral Moore for the tireless work and efforts over the weekend, thank you.

This year we had 21 teams compete over the weekend in 5 divisions and we look forward to more teams in the future. The number of teams entering was affected by several issues and this year the unfortunate incident for Hockey Albury Wodonga, which we pass on our deepest sympathies and condolences.

West Gippsland also this year was unable to field a team but with support both locally and from the wider hockey community we hope to see back next year.

The support from all competitors was great and this allowed me to have very easy championships and to them I say thank you. To all the teams that travelled many kilometres I acknowledge this as a huge effort and anything I was able to do to accommodate I was more than happy to do.

I would also like to thank the individual team coordinators for their efforts as this allowed me to have a very easy run as Tournament Director, the conduct of all teams was

exemplary and the opportunity to have regional development hours put into local umpires from across the state is fantastic.

Over the tournament the opportunity to conduct three umpire development programs was undertaken. The level 1 Umpire Coach, Level 1 Technical official and Level 1 Umpire Workshop

An Umpire Coach course was conducted over two days with components and modules from the new training manual in operation. Over the two days we had some 9 participants for the level 1 UC course and they had an opportunity to complete this next level of officiating as part of their long term development. With these new UC"s in place regional associations are able to deliver accredited training for their new and developing umpires. This opportunity was not taken by metro umpires and this I feel is an area that should be addressed for the future. If the Women's Country Championships can deliver these programs I do not understand why the same should not be done at other events or tournaments within Hockey Victoria calendar.

A level 1 Umpire Theory course was conducted on Sunday afternoon and 10 people attended. Courtney Pearson delivered this session and was supported by Aaron Kennett. This presentation showcased the opportunities available to young umpires and clearly showed a realistic pathway that is attainable, this session is important for all umpires seeking to attain their Level 1 accreditation.

To all the attendees over the weekend I say thanks and welcome you into the support roles for the future.

The biggest benefit for this tournament and regional associations is the fact this tournament was able to deliver these three education sessions and will ensure development opportunities should be part of all senior country championships not just the women's as has been the case for many years.

I would also like to thank Mark Frost, Aaron Kennett, Phil Frost, Neil Hall, Scott Robinson, Maddie Storr, Stef Coote and Stephen Heselwood for their assistance to Courtney over the tournament. Your support and dedication is greatly appreciated. Without their help the courses would have not been possible as the need to have a suitable person drew me away from my major tournament priorities for extended periods. Your support of both Courtney and myself was and is always greatly welcomed and appreciated

With Hockey Victoria coordinating the event and host associations such as Geelong the event is able to foster and develop both players and officials. Having said this some teething issues did occur and the most time consuming was the need to continually chase information that needed to be on the Hockey Victoria website so all people could find and

see easily. The process of all information only going out on the Hockey E-comm system may be in the minds as the only way but I feel the need to still have this information being seen publicly. The Hockey E-comms was updated on March 28th then next update on April 23rd this then informed associations that the Senior Country Championships was on and closing dates for entries was due on May 1st some 7 days after becoming visible to the general public, if they knew to look under the E-comms area. Whilst it is fine to say this info is available on E-comms how are people supposed to find it? Information on educations opportunities also suffered this way and this I feel is an area that can be done better.

I pride myself on delivering what we said we would but sometimes wonder why this is done when the same is not done at other times. This year a major emphasis was put on education for officials and this we did deliver, this did increase the workload for the tournament and with this in mind I was able to secure the services of people I trust that could assist me in all the necessary roles. The need for such emphasis is clear and with having some people having to travel between the Men's SCC and the Women's to complete the education opportunities they want and need for their own and their association benefits. To these people I say thanks it was a huge effort.

The need for umpire development was also evident when we had the pleasure of one young female umpire making the daily trip from Waverley to Geelong, so she could be mentored coached and developed in her umpiring. To Isabel Wright I say well done and you and any of your fellow umpires in Waverley are always welcome to attend such events in the future. Isabel had to travel via train departing Waverley and arriving in Geelong by 9am on each day of the tournament, this clearly shows her dedication and desire for development.

As part of the requirements for being an approved HV presenter the need for people to attend one such education seminar as conducted by HV and overseen by HA, I ensured we had all presenters accredited and would hope these people that made that commitment are rewarded for this effort and is not utilised in allocating course presentations to people that did not attended such necessary course accreditation

My recommendations for this tournament and in the future both Men's and Women's is that information is clearly and easily found on the HV website.

On Saturday night Hockey Geelong staged a tournament function which was attended by One Hundred and Fifty people to celebrate the 91st anniversary of the staging of Women's Country Championships. This opportunity to conduct a social gathering within the

immediate playing surrounds ensured the opportunity for regional associations to mix and bond like they used to in earlier times.

I am currently working through all the accreditation paperwork and umpire reports with the assistance of Courtney Pearson but am mindful of her having major exams with one being conducted on the Tuesday immediately after the tournament. My goal is to have all reports and feedback forms sent to all umpires, technical officials, and umpire coaches by the end of this week.

One other recommendation I make is the need to refine the timing of information going out and having all current versions of training materials available.

I thank Chris Chittick for all her support in the lead up and during the tournament. I greatly appreciate your support and friendship you extend to me.

The final recommendation I make is that the naming of the Country 11 be done at the tournament or at the very least the timing of that announcement. This year no contact was made to me to arrange any allocation of time for this to occur and with many people travelling I feel the benefit for the hockey community needs to be taken into account.
