These are important documents as they display due diligence. It also meets a requirement of the Rules to give to any new member elected to the Committee of the Association documents clearly outlining the operations of the Association.

## **Grounds and Safety**

Firstly, I would like to start this report by thanking Gordon for all his ongoing work in and around Stead Park. A lot of work around the place just gets done without being noticed and that is due to him. Secondly I would like to make mentions others that have tirelessly hep with the ongoing management of the Stead park grounds, again most of it going unnoticed it just gets done.

A few projects that have taken place at Stead Park this year are:

- 1. Unless you have been living under a rock! You will have noticed that we have new score boards!!!!
- 2. Two new change rooms were constructed where the undercover area around the end of the pavilion once stood. The area was built in and transformed into alternative change rooms for players now that we have a second pitch.
- 3. For those not aware a baby change table erected in the disabled toilet for anyone with young ones requiring this particular service.
- 4. A second first aid cabinet was placed between the two pitches in the tech bench area for easier access for simple first aid needs.
- 5. New storage shelving for the (Gordon's) storage shed that is located at the end of the pavilion facing the ground (not the equipment cages).
- 6. We have been successful in gaining another grant for a second defibrillator that will be placed between the two pitches. For those of you not aware, we were fortunate to have a defibrillator available for an incidence involving a local player this season. The availability of the defibrillator saved the players life. The rest of the grant money will be used to train local umpires in CPR and first aid at the beginning of next season.

As mentioned, the above projects and many smaller jobs don't just happen. It's through the hard work and dedication of a few people. In the likelihood that I attempt to name all involved and happen to forget someone; I am going to take the easy way out and say these people know who they are. I also know these people have been thanked personally for their time and effort. I would like to say that although we did have the help this year and achieve many of the things on our "to do list", there is always more to do. As always; it seems to be the same people that put up their hand or are happy to help if asked. I was recently away and saw a sign in a hockey pavilion in Queensland that I would love to replicate and place statically around Stead Park.

## **Competition Committee**

This year saw the committee deal with two major issues that have had a positive effect on hockey in Geelong.

The first issue was the distortion in the number of teams in the two Men's Divisions. We addressed this and had a balanced competition with six teams in Division 1 and seven teams in Division 2. We also made promotion and relegation of one team between the division mandatory to maintain this balance.

The women and junior competitions were conducted along similar guidelines to previous seasons except for the under 11 competitions which saw the introduction of a competition at Stead Park, under 11 North, to accommodate the grow in the juniors from the clubs based at Stead Park.

The second issue that was dealt with was the revision and rewriting of the bylaws governing players playing multiple games in one round and qualification of players for finals. The rules were rewritten as to not grant an advantage to the larger clubs.

I would like to thank Wendy Climpson as the Senior Match Convenor and Claire Barnes as the Junior Match Convenor for their commitment and dedication to their roles, without them the competition would not have run as seamlessly as it did.

I would also like to thanks the clubs for their participation in the governing of the competition, all clubs were active in the process and the competition was better for the input from all clubs.

Next season we need to tidy up the finals qualification rules, especially were junior players are concerned as there were a few issues that were raised late in the season.

The one area I was disappointed in was the number of complaints that centred around disrespect for the umpires, this is something that will be needed to be addressed next season. As an association, we need to foster a better relationship between the players and officials at all levels.



## Hook in2 Hockey 2016

Liaising with Eliza Caldecott from Hockey Victoria, Alison O'Reilly (GHC), Steve Canton (Saints) and Geoff Carlisle (Corio) organised Hook in2 Hockey Clinics for their own club and then following these Hin2H sessions the 3 clubs combined (for the first time in 2016) to offer an Intra Club Program for new players from the age of 5 years old upwards. Conducting the sessions at Stead Park, ather than participating in the Modified Under 8 competition at Lloyd Reserve, Newtown meant we could offer a close local venue for children of **Northern Suburb** families **to learn a new sport**.

With Saints and Corio trying to reinvigorate their Junior Section and for Geelong Hockey Club, increasing numbers on what already is a growing Junior section – this was a great scheme that allowed kids to have fun with hockey through games in a safe environment. Having a combined session meant there were enough playing numbers to split into 3 groups.

The sessions were run throughout Term 2 and Term 3 with coaches from each club whilst Alison O'Reilly coordinated the program. The Session consisted of about 10-15 minutes of skills then the coaches chose fun games to learn hockey in. As numbers and skills grew, the kids were then put into teams and the played against each other (within each of the 3 groups). Ideally, we would love more participants to organise a fixture/roster of games within our program, but due to lack of numbers within each group, sometimes this was not possible.

Hockey Victoria are encouraging clubs to implement this program within their own club to encourage players to develop without the pressure of a proper competition. The intra club program allows for mistakes, more ball touches per participant and coaches can take time out to explain rules, skills, technique whenever they want...whereas a competition scenario does not allow for this. Hockey Geelong do offer a modified Under 8 program, but this does not allow for older kids to participate without feeling pressure to understand the skills and rules of the game in an actual match.

It should be all about **confidence with the kids**....once they feel confident of understanding the game, some rules and a little bit about positions, then and only then should they be offered a spot in an actual competition team whether it be Under 8 or Under 11's. Some kids are born ready for competition and are able to pick up a new sport in a confident manner....most kids are shy and lack the confidence of being placed into a team immediately.

Throughout the 2 terms, the participant numbers were roughly: Geelong – 14, Saints - 13 and Corio -9. Some players actually continued on into an Under 11 team – which was fantastic to see.

Hopefully through clinics in schools, we can encourage more kids to come and try hockey....leading from this we hope they continue on with the Intra Club program in 2017.

Geelong Hockey Club was also involved in the new Northern Hub Under 11 competition which was, in essence, a Home and Away competition. This allowed Hockey Geelong to promote 2 x Under 11 competitions...one Southern Hub competition at Lloyd Reserve, Newtown and the Northern Hub competition which was about 50% at Stead Park (Synthetic Turf), 25% at Drysdale (Synthetic Turf) and 25% at Lloyd Reserve (on Grass). The travelling to each venue was well received and allowed each club some Home games. Playing Under 11 on synthetic turf allowed the kids to continue with their skills since they trained on a synthetic pitch. It also allowed clubs to pick which competition was going to be convenient to them – North of Geelong OR South of Geelong. Geelong started the season with about 8 – 9 players...which was probably not enough for a full pitch game so sometimes the game was modified to ¾ pitch. By the end of the season (and the success of the Intra Club program), our Under 11 team grew to 14 players.

We were fortunate enough to finish 2<sup>nd</sup> in this competition. A grand effort as most our players had not played <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> - Full pitch hockey before. It was a big learning curve but a very rewarding season for them.

We did not have enough players to field an Under 15 team...so with a lot of organizing and with the intention of getting our GHC players a game of hockey each week, we were able to find them other club teams that were willing to allow them to play for the season in the hope that in 2017 we were able to re-group and submit a team again. Thanks to Kardinia and Saints Hockey Clubs for being hospitable to our players.

Our Junior base is slowing growing from the initial redevelopment back in 2014. Hopefully with the support of our Senior Section and with continued support from Hockey Victoria getting into schools on our behalf, our Juniors will continue to grow in numbers.

#### Senior School:

## **Umpire's Report**

Season 2016 was a challenging year for umpiring in Geelong. There still needs to be clubs doing more to provide new umpires and support the development of umpiring.

There was evidence this year of significant disrespect by both senior players and junior coaches towards umpires. The Hockey Geelong Match Committee dealt with these issues commendably but it is disappointing that some umpires now prefer not to be rostered to games involving at least one club. This is unacceptable.

There has been a culture in Geelong over the years that an umpire is open to verbal abuse.

In recent years there have been programs such as Play The Whistle where clubs have been educated to respect the umpire. The culture has improved. When the going gets tough in a game some teams however still resort to blaming the umpire.

Umpire coaching and development needs to be improved. This is difficult where many senior umpires are already either umpiring 2 to 3 games per weekend and also in some cases playing. Hockey Geelong should consider allocating financial resources to umpire coaching. The Women's Country Carnival does fulfill a role in providing umpire coaching to those umpires who elect to umpire this weekend. It is disappointing that few umpires take up this opportunity. Every senior umpire needs constant training and development to cope with the much tougher club match environment. Here there is a mix of players with ability and umpire knowledge.

It is interesting to note the number of umpires from each club who have umpired in 2016 related to the number of teams from each club. The percentage of games umpired and umpire numbers should be the same percentage number of teams, for each club to meet their umpiring commitment. All Clubs should provide a minimum of 2 umpires per team.

Pre-season for 2016 was short and sharp over about 8 weeks so the intensity was up. With several new players into the group and some familiar faces returning we were excited about what was in front of us.

The playing group bonded quickly as we set our sights on some practice games at the Werribee Cup. Turns out we had a fantastic weekend winning all of our games and taking out first place, what a perfect lead in to the season. With a playing list consisting of some exciting young players as well as some more senior leaders we had a reasonable spread of ages and experience. Our average list age was 25.

As a coaching group, we had a few objectives early in the season, we wanted to make sure that training attendance was up, trainings were more intense and competitive than previous and we were challenging the playing group as well as the players individually. This equates to some One Hundred and Twenty umpire assessments and feedback sessions. Thanks to Stephen Heselwood, Mark Frost, Scott Robinson, Neil Hall and Aaron Kennet along with Michael Clark who elected not to play hockey to come to Geelong to further develop his umpire coaching skills.

To all the volunteers for Hockey Geelong that manned the Canteen and ensured the facility was cleaned during the day please accept my thanks.

To our First Aid Officer Coral Moore for the tireless work and efforts over the weekend, thank you.

This year we had 20 teams compete over the weekend in 5 divisions and we look forward to more teams in the future. The number of teams entering was affected by several issues and this year we had Hockey Albury Wodonga return after an unfortunate incident.

West Gippsland also this year was unable to field a team but with support both locally and from the wider hockey community we hope to see back next year.

The support from all competitors was great and this allowed me to have very easy championships and to them I say thank you. To all the teams that travelled many kilometres I acknowledge this as a huge effort and anything I was able to do to accommodate I was more than happy to do.

I would also like to thank the individual team coordinators for their efforts as this allowed me to have a very easy run as Tournament Director, the conduct of all teams was exemplary and the opportunity to have regional development hours put into local umpires from across the state is fantastic.

# Over the tournament the opportunity to conduct three umpire development programs was undertaken. The level 1 Umpire Coach, Level 1 Technical official and Level 1 Umpire Workshop

An Umpire Coach course was conducted over two days with components and modules from the new training manual in operation. Over the two days we had some 9 participants for the level 1 UC course and they had an opportunity to complete this next level of officiating as part of their long term development. With these new UC''s in place regional associations are able to deliver accredited training for their new and developing umpires. If the Women's Senior Country Championships can deliver these programs, I do not understand why Men's Senior Country Championships do not deliver all these courses as part of the reason for the additional costs for tournament entry was to cover these course fees,

A level 1 Umpire Theory course was conducted on Sunday afternoon and 10 people attended. Courtney Pearson delivered this session and was supported by Aaron Kennett. This presentation showcased the opportunities available to young umpires and clearly showed a realistic pathway that is attainable, this session is important for all umpires seeking to attain their Level 1 accreditation. To all the attendees over the weekend I say thanks and welcome you into the support roles for the future.

The biggest benefit for this tournament and regional associations is the fact this tournament was able to deliver these three education sessions and will ensure development opportunities should be part of all senior country championships not just the women as has been the case for many years.

I would also like to thank Mark Frost, Aaron Kennett, Phil Frost, Neil Hall, Scott Robinson, and Stephen Heselwood for their assistance to Courtney over the tournament. Your support and dedication is greatly appreciated. Without their help the courses would have not been possible as the need to have a suitable person drew me away from my major tournament priorities for extended periods. Your support of both Courtney and myself was and is always greatly welcomed and appreciated

With Hockey Victoria coordinating the event and host associations such as Geelong the event is able to foster and develop both players and officials. Having said this some teething issues did occur and the most time consuming was the need to continually chase information that needed to be on the Hockey Victoria website so all people could find and see easily. The process of all information only going out on the Hockey E-comm system may be in the minds as the only way but I feel the need to still have this information being seen publicly. This year some issues on having information available for teams to see on the HV website creates issues with people being able to plan seek course and then have time to register and arrange accommodation.

The need for umpire development was also evident when we had the pleasure of one young female umpire making the daily trip from Waverley to Geelong, so she could be mentored coached and developed in her umpiring. To Isabel Wright I say well done and you and any of your fellow umpires in Waverley are always welcome to attend such events in the future. Isabel had to travel via train departing Waverley and arriving in Geelong by 8am on each day of the tournament, this clearly shows her dedication and desire for development. Isabel was a pleasure to have you attend.

As part of the requirements for being an approved HV presenter the need for people to attend one such education seminar as conducted by HV and overseen by HA, I ensured we had all presenters accredited and would hope these people that made that commitment are rewarded for this effort and not utilised in allocating course presentations to people that did not attended such necessary course accreditation

My recommendations for this tournament and in the future both Men's and Women's is that information is clearly and easily found on the HV website.

I am currently working through all the accreditation paperwork and umpire reports with the assistance of Courtney Pearson but am mindful of her having major assignments to complete as part of Double Degree in Forensic Science and Criminology. My goal is to have all reports and feedback forms sent to all umpires, technical officials, and umpire coaches by the end of this week. One other recommendation I make is the need to refine the timing of information going out and having all current versions of training materials available.

I thank Chris Chittick for all her support in the lead up and during the tournament. I greatly appreciate your support and friendship you extend to me.

To Sash Herseg it was a pleasure to have your attendance at the Presentations along with David from GJ Gardner Homes. Finally, able to put a face to a name. Great to have had the opportunity to chat and also to show you first hand the staging and community support for this championships by not only Geelong but the wider hockey community
